

S. 83. Joint resolution of thanks to Captain David G. Farragut, of the United States navy, and to the officers and men under his command.

The House of Representatives has rejected the bill of the Senate (S. 306) regulating the appointment of second lieutenants in the marine corps.

The President of the United States approved and signed, on the first instant, the following acts:

H. R. 312. An act to provide internal revenue to support the government and pay interest on the public debt.

H. R. 364. An act to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri river to the Pacific ocean, and to secure to the government the use of the same for postal, military, and other purposes.

H. R. 391. An act to punish and prevent the practice of polygamy in the Territories of the United States, and other places, and disapproving and annulling certain acts of the legislative assembly of the Territory of Utah.

H. R. 515. An act to provide for the appointment of an Indian agent in Colorado Territory.

H. R. 425. An act to incorporate the Guardian Society and reform juvenile offenders in the District of Columbia.

H. R. 521. An act for the relief of William B. Dodd and others. And on the second instant he approved and signed the following acts:

H. R. 442. An act to establish a land district in the Territory of Nevada, and for other purposes.

H. R. 371. An act to prescribe an oath of office, and for other purposes.

H. R. 530. An act granting a pension to Lawrence P. N. Landrum, of Taylor county, Kentucky.

H. R. 428. An act for the relief of the president and directors of the Panama Railroad Company.

On motion by Mr. Lane, of Indiana,

The bill (S. 321) for the relief of certain companies of Indiana volunteers, who lost their baggage and other property at Hatteras inlet, was read the second time, and considered as in Committee of the Whole; and having been amended on the motion of Mr. Lane, of Indiana, it was reported to the Senate, and the amendment was concurred in.

*Ordered*, That the bill be engrossed and read a third time.

The said bill was read the third time by unanimous consent.

*Resolved*, That it pass, and that the title thereof be as aforesaid.

*Ordered*, That the Secretary request the concurrence of the House of Representatives therein.
